Risk Assessment Template for Big Skies – Cotswold Glamping Campsite

Big Skies – Cotswold Glamping and camping is a public campsite with toilet and shower facilities, that is often used by members of the public and by groups. The site is accessed via the A436.

Big Skies management seek to reduce risks by providing their own site specific risk assessment that can encourage members of the public to reduce these risks. We provide the template below only as a guide, and expect that each individual or group will assess their own risks.

Horses and dogs do occasionally range over the campsite and can also be sources of infection.

Burning from fire, especially from firepits or camp cooking	 Respect the advertised distances required between tents (6m between groups, 3m between tents within one group). Use firepits with care, ensuring they do not get close to flammable material and are not too large or become out of control. Do not attempt to light the fire pit during extremely windy conditions. Site camp cooking facilities carefully, ensuring they are steady and are away from flammable material. Falling injuries both during day light and in dark	 Ensure all guests take care when walking around the site. Ensure all group members have personal lights for use at night. 	The site does have some areas of rough ground, roots and rocks exposed through the woods, steps down to the Hawthorn tent which could cause trips and falls. Steps maybe slippery when wet. There is minimal mains lighting on the campsite, and only at the amenities block. There are some solar lanterns on paths down to the Hawthorn tent and down through the woods to the amenities block. Rough ground is therefore a hazard, especially at night.
Cuts from barbed wire	• Please be aware that there may be areas where some barbed wire is present. (Brief on areas on arrival).	Most barbed wire has been cleared and replaced with plain wire but some may still be present in certain areas.
Knives and lighters	• The tents are equipped with a set of knives and a lighter. Efforts have been made to locate them inside the blanket box, young children must be supervised at all times when inside the tents to help prevent accidental use of knives and lighters.	Cuts from knives and setting the tent on fire could occur due to incorrect use, or if young children are left un supervised.

Emergency Services	 The campsite has good mobile phone coverage. Phone power-bank chargers can be rented from the honesty shop. Any used power-banks should be placed in the basket provided and will be recharged daily. The campsite management can be contacted via phone on 07866672831/07704900342. If they are not at the campsite they will arrange for a local friend to deal with any on-site emergencies, or an alternative number will be provided.
